NAVAL TRAINING CENTER LANDFILL REMEDIATION PROJECT

The site of the Naval Training Center (NTC) Remediation Project is a landfill associated with the former NTC property transferred to San Diego International Airport, west of and immediately adjacent to Terminal 2 West. The landfill was closed by the Navy in 1971.

The Airport Authority, the Port of San Diego and the U. S. Navy conducted investigations and based on their analysis of the site, the project work will consist of removing household refuse (identified as municipal solid waste) and burn ash (which results from the burning of municipal solid waste).

The Airport Authority began Phase 1 of the NTC Landfill Remediation Project in January 2008, with work to clean a 20 foot utility easement on the westerly portion of the site.

PHASE 2 BEGINS THE FIRST WEEK OF AUGUST

Phase 2 begins the first week of August, with cleaning the remainder and the majority of the landfill site. Once the waste materials are excavated, they will be loaded into trucks and transported to properly permitted landfills. There will be as many as 100 trucks per day accessing and leaving the site via McCain Road at North Harbor Drive, west of the airport. Workdays will be Monday through Saturday from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Phase 2 will be completed in mid-2009. Relocation of the utilities, removal of the waste materials and disposal at properly permitted solid waste landfills, and installation of a compacted sub grade will prepare the site for future airport improvements and remove a potential source of groundwater contaminants. From beginning to end the project will be completed in a year's time. The remediation for the site will enhance SDIA and the surrounding environment.
