Philosophy:

- Protect Peninsula single family neighborhoods against Accessory Dwelling Unit (ADU) over development currently being enacted and proposed by city and state government.
- Preserve neighborhood parking against government efforts to force citizens into mass transit use.
- Make San Diego Affordable by fighting excessive tax and fee increases currently being considered by city and county government
- Preserve Peninsula beach and bay free parking against proposals to rescind it.
- Maintain the Peninsula's quality of life by fighting the Midway Rising project overdevelopment and traffic congestion...

5. Share anything you wish to accomplish as a member of the board:

I want to preserve neighborhood input into the Peninsula development process while simultaneously protecting the Peninsula against excessive overdevelopment and density which results in parking elimination and traffic congestion. This is currently being promoted by the city and state in the name of "affordable" housing development; whose units are not affordable by low- and moderate-income residents, which eliminates parking, and results in traffic congestion. An example of this is the 4,000+ units of "affordable" housing units proposed as part of the Midway Rising development, which are not affordable, increases density and substantially increases traffic congestion.

I also want to promote San Diego affordability by fighting excessive tax and fee increases currently being considered by San Diego city government. City hall does not face a revenue crisis but rather a spending crisis with automatic annual spending growth rising faster than revenues. They propose to solve this on the backs of taxpayers. The cost burden of city government should be borne equally by the city bureaucracy and taxpayers with no increased taxes and fees until automatic spending growth is removed from the city budget by a reduction of unnecessary city staff, enactment of sustainable cost-of-living increases, pension reform and implementation of streamlined and more efficient city procedures. City spending will automatically increase if left unchecked, which will be funded primarily from increased taxes and fees on city taxpayers which reduces affordability and promotes outmigration of citizens to lower cost of living states. Balance needs to be restored,
