The Peninsula Community Planning Board (PCPB) expresses significant apprehension and concern regarding the current state of traffic safety along Voltaire Street, spanning from Catalina to Froude. Recent reports from several residents living along Voltaire underscore their growing concerns about traffic safety. There is a palpable worry that the city has not given due priority to, nor implemented, any of the traffic safety measures requested by the PCPB. This issue is of paramount importance, and the PCPB is troubled by the potential risks posed to residents, pedestrians, and all those navigating this stretch by various means of transportation. Further delays in addressing these concerns could exacerbate unsafe conditions.

The PCPB strongly advocates for the expeditious installation of the approved and funded traffic safety mitigations previously requested. The lack of response thus far to the urgent matter of traffic safety along Voltaire Street between Catalina and Froude is disconcerting to our community.

Installation of these approved and funded items is our **top priority**.

- Flashing light pedestrian crosswalk at the Voltaire and Froude intersection
- Flashing speed indicator sign along Voltaire between Froude and Bolinas

We have identified additional safety measures that we believe will significantly enhance the well-being of our community members. Given the increased urgency and frequency of traffic incidents in this area, we believe additional measures are crucial to ensuring the safety of pedestrians and motorists alike.

In our opinion, approval and funding for the following additional measures should be the **next priority**:

- Additional flashing speed indicator sign along Voltaire between Froude and Bolinas (therefore indicators on each side of the street)
- Speed enforcement along Voltaire
- Additional speed limit signs along Voltaire
- Flashing light pedestrian crosswalk at the Voltaire and Guizot intersection near bus stop

Additional speed limit signs placed strategically along this route will serve the Voltaire Street corridor. Additional speed limit signs placed reinforce the designated speed limit and educate drivers about the need to adhere to it. We believe that this visual reminder will contribute to a safer and more conscientious flow of traffic in the specified area.

We understand the challenges that the city faces in addressing traffic safety concerns, and we appreciate your ongoing efforts to prioritize the safety of our community. We hope that these additional requests will be considered with urgency and dedication.


